

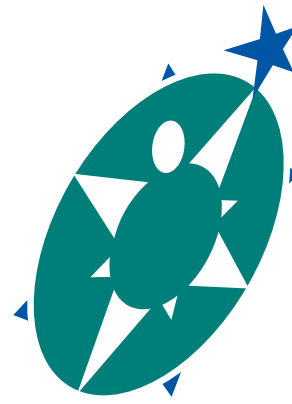
Our Pledge of Service

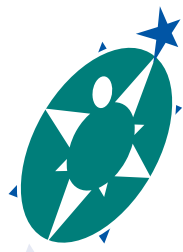

About Foundations Community Partnership

Foundations Community Partnership (FCP) is a nonprofit foundation formed to support the behavioral health and human service needs of children and young adults in Bucks County. At the core of our endeavors is a partnership to create service-learning internships linking public agencies, nonprofit organizations, businesses, colleges and young adults from within our community. We also award scholarships to high school seniors who demonstrate potential for careers in human services, and provide grants to outstanding nonprofit organizations that serve children and teens.

Our Vision

FCP aspires to be a catalyst for improving the quality of life in Bucks County. We are committed to developing community-focused, youth-based service learning opportunities, providing grants and scholarships, and supporting community education, research and training.

Our Mission

FCP promotes innovative services to improve the lives of residents in the community, with a special emphasis on young people. We are forging active partnerships with the public and private sectors to continue the community-based programs started by our predecessor organization, Foundations Behavioral Health, with the goal of creating new initiatives. With our commitment to identifying needs and problem solving, we will communicate and deliver these services through research, education, publication and collaborative approaches.

Our History

FCP traces its roots to a pioneering facility established more than 40 years ago to provide behavioral health services in the region -- the Delaware Valley Mental Health Foundation, a small psychiatric hospital opened in 1964 in Doylestown. By 1996, that facility had become known as Foundations Behavioral Health and its scope expanded to encompass a full range of behavioral health services for children and adolescents. Those services today include acute inpatient and partial hospitalization care, residential treatment, outpatient services, and an alternative school.

In 2007, the hospital was sold to a for-profit organization. As a result of the sale, FCP was established to continue the research, publishing, community education, internship, scholarship and grantmaking activities of the Foundation. FCP is an independent operating foundation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue code.

Our Philosophy

We believe that:

- Human services concerns can be identified and resolved within the local community.
- Private and public organizations working together can address unmet service needs and other underlying community problems, and provide creative solutions to improve the quality of life for all residents.
- Service-learning partnerships pairing young adults with businesses and academic institutions provide lasting benefits to the community.
- Scholarships and grants-in-aid to young adults showing interest in and aptitude for careers in human services will reflect their individual interests and be a positive influence in the community.
- Grants and other financial support of selected private and public organizations encourage innovative problem-solving.
- Communication of outcomes through research, education and seminars motivates others to act as change agents.

Our Goals and Objectives

- Identify human service needs within the nonprofit organization community in Bucks County.
- Encourage development of innovative services and collaboration within the Bucks County nonprofit community through grants and educational services.
- Provide opportunities for stakeholders to participate in resolving community issues of concern to all Bucks County residents.
- Recruit, train, supervise and provide leadership for qualified young adults to participate in service learning opportunities to help meet community needs.
- Support research efforts to identify and communicate practical and effective treatment guidelines and disseminate them through workshops, seminars and professional publications.
